Lung Cancer ScreeningFrequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How can a counseling and shared decision-making visit be billed?

- The G code G0296 Counseling visit to discuss need for lung cancer screening (LDCT) using low-dose CT scan (service is for eligibility determination and shared decision-making), should be used for the shared-decision making visit
- When <u>National Coverage Determination</u> (NCD) requirements for the counseling and shared decision-making visit are met, the counseling visit G0296 code can be billed with an E/M visit or an annual wellness visit with the -25 modifier. (Find more information on the American College of Radiology <u>FAQ webpage</u>)
- Medicare will deny G0296 for claims that do not contain these ICD-10 diagnosis codes:
 - o **Z87.891** for former smokers (personal history of nicotine dependence)
 - o **F17.21** for current smokers (nicotine dependence)
